

The Santa Claus Town Council met in regular session on August 09, 2021 at the Santa Claus Town Hall located at 90 N Holiday Blvd Santa Claus, In.

The meeting was called to order by President, Michael Johannes at 5:30 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance

The Public Hearing was opened concerning, ORDINANCE 2021-10 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10.16.110 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF SANTA CLAUS CONCERNING WASTEWATER RATES AND CHARGES.

Don Vogel asked for clarification on the process concerning the vacant lots, as Patmore stated the burden of proof is on the owner to prove the property is in good standing concerning the vacant lot wastewater fee. Vogel stated three classifications: an owner who owns the lot next to his house, a delinquent lot and someone that has to show proof of payment of a lot in good standing. Greulich stated the town's software system has to search by name of owner or account number it is not capable of searching by lot number or subdivision number unfortunately. This will be a process and it will take time. If a vacant lot is in good standing on 1/1/2022 they will receive a credit of \$ 1,930.00 towards a tap fee per the ordinance 2021-10 a tap fee for wastewater goes up 2% every year on January 1 of that year.

Mike Johannes asked if there were any more questions or concerns? With no further questions or concerns Kevin Burke made a motion to close the public hearing and Seth Windell seconded the motion.

Dee Mulzer stated a lot sold in her subdivision at the tax sale for \$ 100.00 so is the town that well off that they are just going to forgive those fees? Greulich stated I can answer that question the County provided the town with a list of all the lots that sold at this special tax sale and those lots are not in good standing with the town of Santa Claus meaning the new owner will pay a total tap fee of \$ 1,930.17 in 2021.

MINUTES FOR REVIEW

Seth Windell made a motion to approve the June 14, 2021 as written and Jason little seconded the motion.

Don Vogel stated why is the burden of proof on the new owner to show a vacant lot is in good standing? Patmore stated the new owner can go to the courthouse and file paperwork to have a title search done. Greulich stated our software only goes back to 2014 the office is currently staffed with only three people.

Sherrill Clark asked if it could be explained to her since she is building in 2022 how will that work, the lot is in good standing. Greulich stated as a vacant lot owner in good standing you will receive a credit of \$ 1,930.00 toward your sewer tap. If you are building in 2022 you will only pay the 2% difference for your tap in fee. As it was stated before the tap fee increases 2% every year.

COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR

Charlene Hess was present she had dropped off information for the council to look over, Clerk-Treasurer Kelly Greulich emailed the documents out to the council on July 29, 2021 and were in the council's packet tonight. Hess asked that the council please look at the facts before you make any decisions concerning the coal to diesel plant.

Michael Johannes stated to those present that all major projects start with gathering information and this project is no different. A conversation will have to take place between Riverview, the Town of Dale and the Town of Santa Claus. The Town of Santa Claus has engineering studies that date back to 2017 concerning water lines for the coal to diesel plant.

Patricia Vaal asked why the 30-day time frame for a response from the letter Mike Johannes sent? Johannes stated he is the executive officer of the town and meets with people all the time in regards to town matters.

Scot Elliott asked if he could speak, Elliott President of the water board (for Santa Claus) the water board was approached in March of 2017 by a couple council members from Dale at a public water board meeting, no commitment was made but the water board did spend money on a feasibility study at that time. The water board has been diligently working on a list of capital projects for the next ten, twenty years. Not sure where Dale is on this issue but it is not our problem to figure out. What I do know is Santa Claus can provide raw water if need be. Most of the easements Santa Claus already has and if we don't, they are in the County right-a-ways.

Charlene Hess asked if the town would be using capital money for the raw water line? Elliott said let me make this clear the town of Santa Claus will not spend any of their money to put this line in. If this project is done then Riverview will pay for it.

Kevin Burke stated people need to contact the council and let them know how you feel about Riverview, if you see us at the grocery store the post office talk to us. As elected officials the council should be listening to what our residents want and what is best for the town of Santa Claus. When it comes time to vote on the matter and I or one the council members vote to move forward when most of the people in Santa Claus have expressed their feelings against the plant, come November the residents will more than likely vote someone else to the town council.

Paul Kovacs stated it is the quality of life that we are worried about, Santa Claus is a great community and I would hate to see that change.

Sara Winters stated this is mind boggling why would the council even consider this plant. We all want progress; we all want infrastructure. We all know what diesel smells like. This will stink just like the papermill across the river. It will pollute our water and people have said if this refinery is built, they will be moving away from Santa Claus. Do you want that to happen?

Michael Johannes stated I can assure you the town of Santa Claus will do it's due diligent concerning any projects the town decides to do.

Larry Ball stated I want to talk very briefly about what Kevin Burke mentioned earlier about at poll time you make your decision well that rubs me the wrong way, we want to be proactive, we want you to hear us now. I want simple information. I use to stay informed by the minutes online I don't want to listen to a recording for 2 hours just for 10 minutes of information. The minutes have not been online for years! Kelly Greulich stated are you sure you are looking at the correct website www.townofsantaclaus.com late last year the town accepted bids for a new website. Ball stated he could have been looking at an old website and if so he apologies. Greulich also stated she will follow up concerning the minutes. Seth Windell stated it looks like the minutes were last updated in February. Greulich apologized and stated she will take care of this tomorrow.

Patricia Vaal stated I want the town to grow and prosper, my kids will never move back because we need more commercial/industrial businesses to keep people here but not a refinery. I see Heather Gries is present and her family stands to profit from this plant by the purchasing of their land from Riverview and that is a huge conflict of interest. Did Dales council tell you to write that letter that was sent to Santa Claus council members?

Heather Gries introduced herself I am District 2 Commissioner which encompasses Dale & Santa Claus districts stated she is not a property owner and was asked by one of your council members to reach out to Dale town board and encourage a meeting to take place. I want to thank both the town of Dale and the town of Santa Claus for collaborating together. As a county commissioner I want to see local governments working together for the betterment. I want this for my County so we can have the assessed value that we need to have. As well as being able to develop the state corridor. Why don't we want to capitalize on our mid state's corridor? The email was submitted to Ray Striegel president of Dale's town board and Michael Johannes of Santa Claus town board along with the clerk-treasurers who then emailed out to their boards. I want this to be a regional development that helps other counties as well.

Tricia Vaal are you not worried at all about the negativity that this one company brings with it? Gries stated I think those negativity's have been created by people that have not done full research. Gries stated I appreciate and respect your opinion but that doesn't mean I have to agree with you. The plant is not a refinery but a Direct-Hydrogenation to Coal to Diesel Plant.

Tricia Vaal stated all the government in this County I am brand new to this but I know people and I cannot believe the political games that are being played to get Riverview here from the state on down. Maybe I am just elected official ignorance. Toying with a company that I know from my research will be a negative impact to my community. Vaal asked about the possibly of Santa Claus and the wastewater for Riverview to Mr. Luthy. Luthy stated it all depends on the metrics of the wastewater from the facility and at this time we don't know what that is. Possibly two options one being the expansion of our current wastewater plant in addition to our current wastewater permit does not allow the town to accept any other wastewater. The town would have to isolate the wastewater and find different technology to treat that wastewater. The states in this country are moving toward a regional concept example Indiana doesn't want to deal with 500 communities which some may only serve 40 customers.

Mary Hess stated according to IDEM it is a refinery by all standards.

Michael Johannes stated IDEM is not going to issue a permit if the plant is negative to the environment.

Jason Little stated he believes the plant will never happen, Riverview is suppose to break ground by the end of 2021 and last I heard no land has been purchased. Seth Windell stated he agrees with Little.

Patricia Vaal made a motion to pursue discussions and studies at no cost to the town of Santa Claus and Seth Windell seconded the motion.

Michael Johannes stated the state of Indiana would like for the town of Santa Claus to take over the old HWY 245, this would be added to the town's road inventory. The state has mentioned they would give the town \$ 200,000.00. Michael would like permission from the council to speak to the state concerning the road.

Jason Little made a motion to approve Michael Johannes to speak to representatives of the state concerning Old HWY 245 and Patricia Vaal seconded the motion.

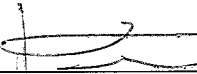

ORDINANCE 2021-10

Good one

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10.16.110 OF
THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF
SANTA CLAUS CONCERNING WASTEWATER RATES AND CHARGES**

WHEREAS, the Town of Santa Claus operates a wastewater utility; and,

WHEREAS, due to the limited number of users at the time the Town established its wastewater utility, a vacant lot assessment was imposed upon some vacant lots in the Town in order to ensure sufficient revenues to support the issuance of bonds utilized to construct the wastewater utility; and,

WHEREAS, if a lot owner pays the vacant lot assessment, the vacant lot assessment is considered a payment toward the capital cost of constructing the wastewater utility, and the Town waives the connection charge when the lot owner subject to the charge connects to the system; and,

WHEREAS, the vacant lot assessment is an administrative burden for the Town, inequitable for owners of lots for which the lot owner will never require connection to the wastewater system, and is no longer necessary to ensure adequate revenue for the wastewater utility; and,

WHEREAS, the Town commissioned a rate study by London Witte Group to determine the necessary charges to maintain the operation of its wastewater utility; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council conducted a public hearing on its rate structure on August 9, 2021, following notice as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Santa Claus, Indiana, that Section 10.16.110 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Santa Claus is hereby amended by deleting Section 10.16.110(2)(D) in its entirety and replacing such section with the following Section 10.16.110(2)(D):

- “D. The connection charge for any lot or parcel of real estate upon which a vacant lot assessment previously has been paid pursuant to the Town’s prior Ordinances shall be reduced by:
1. If such lot was current in payment of vacant lot assessment payments on August 9, 2021, the lot shall receive a credit toward the connection charge of One thousand nine hundred and thirty (\$1,930.00), at the time the lot owner applies for a permit to connect such lot to the public sewer; or,
 2. If such lot was not current in payment of vacant lot assessments on August 9, 2021, such lot shall receive a credit toward the connection charge in an amount equal to the amount for which the lot owner presents proof of payment of vacant lot assessments for the lot on which connection is requested, at the time the lot owner applies for a permit to connect such lot to the public sewer.”

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that Section 10.16.110(3)(B) of the Municipal Code of the Town of Santa Claus is hereby amended by deleting the following paragraph from said Section, effective January 1, 2022:

“The owner of every lot, the property line of which is within three hundred (300) feet of a local or lateral sewer, who does not pay a rate or charge as provided above, shall pay a rate or charge although the property is vacant or unimproved; provided, that in duly recorded covenants and restrictions pertaining to the plat of which such lot is a part, there is a provision that a charge or assessment may be made for sewer availability. Said rate or charge shall be in the amount determinable as follows:

-Carol Hills	\$ 4.00
-Polar Shores	4.00
-All other subdivisions in Christmas Lake Village except Melchoir, and Lake View Subdivisions”	6.00

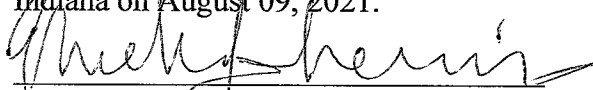
RESOLUTION 2021-09

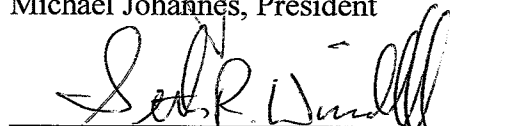

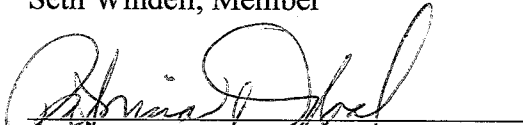
